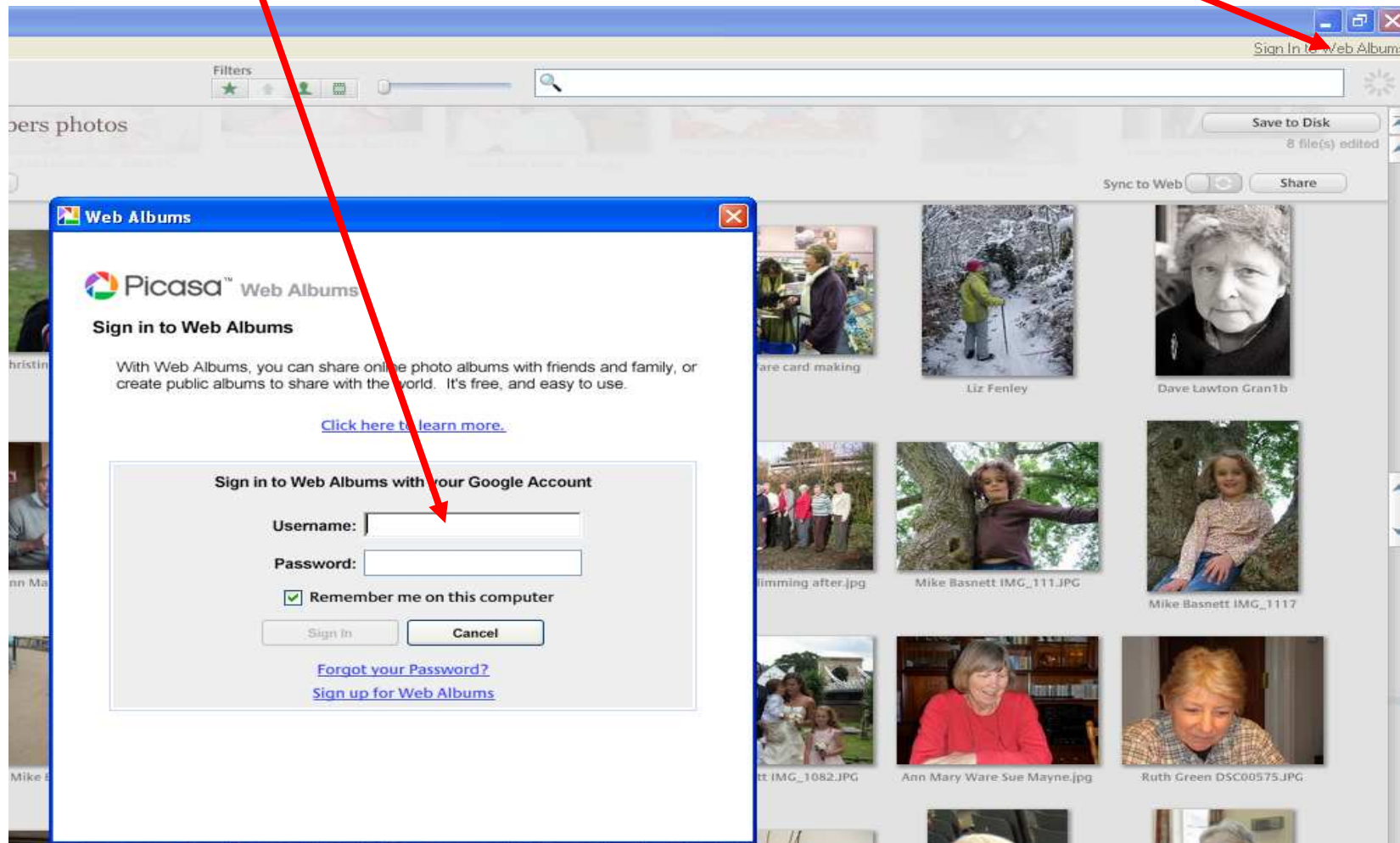


How to create Web Albums in Picasa

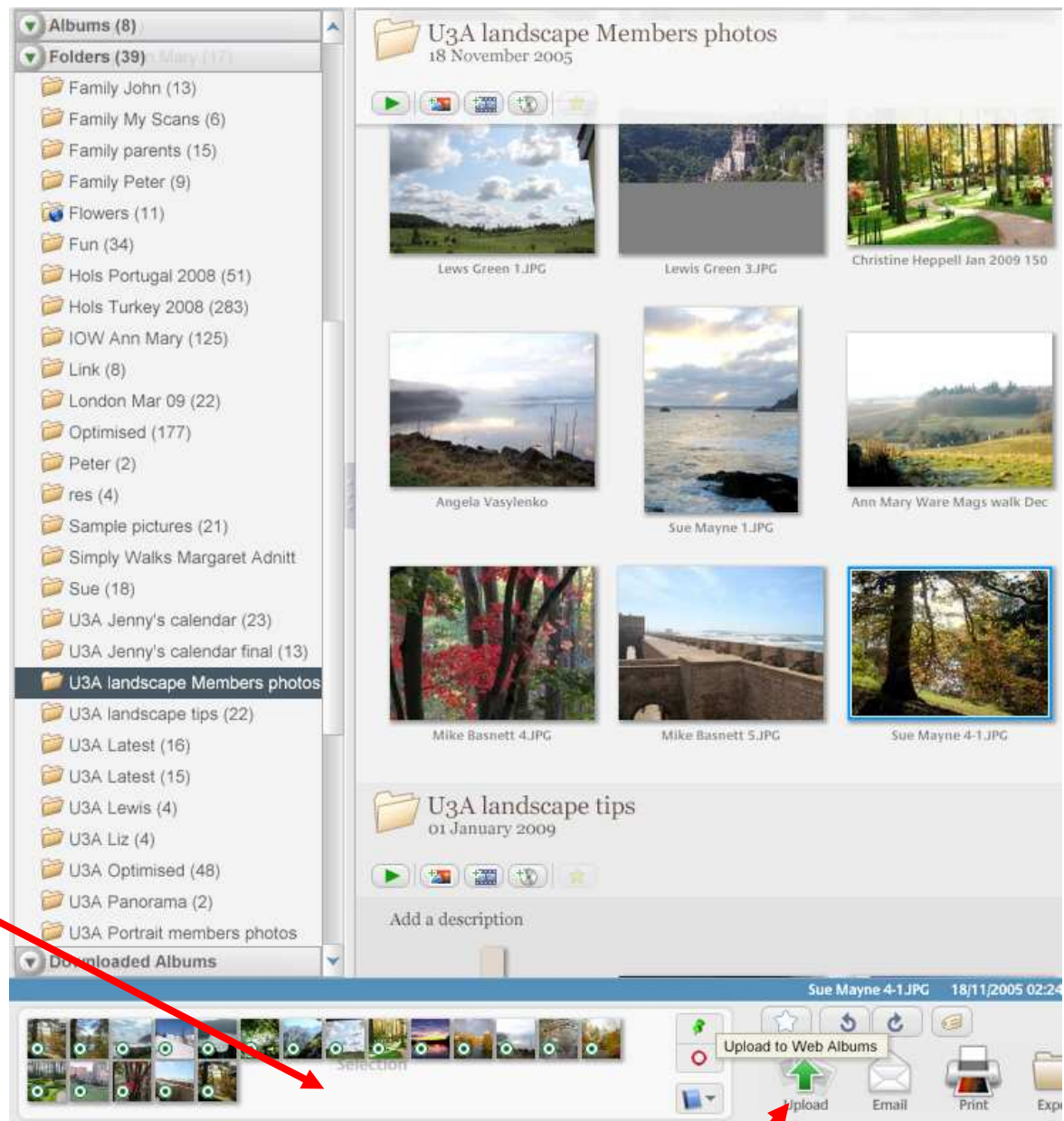

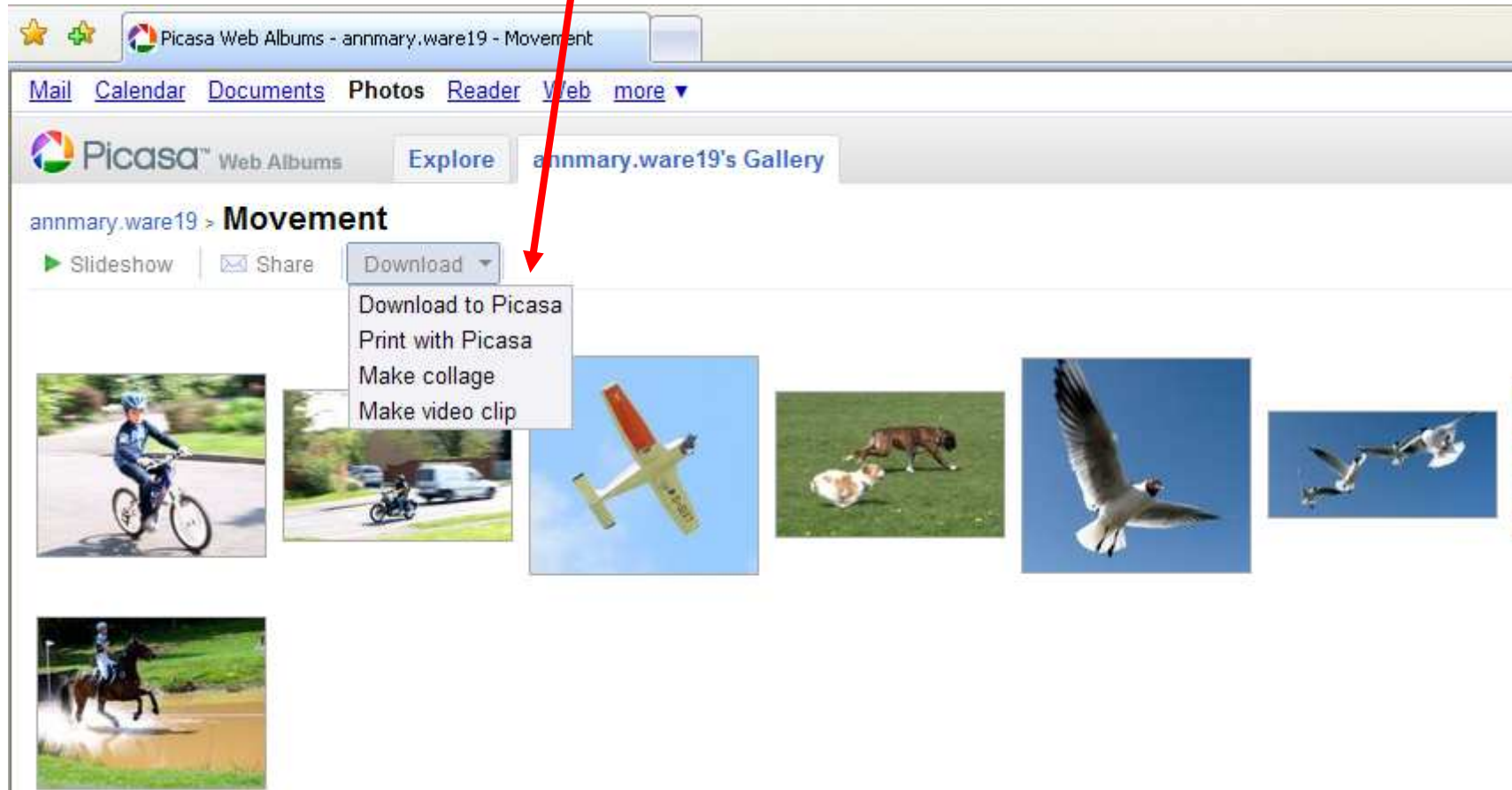

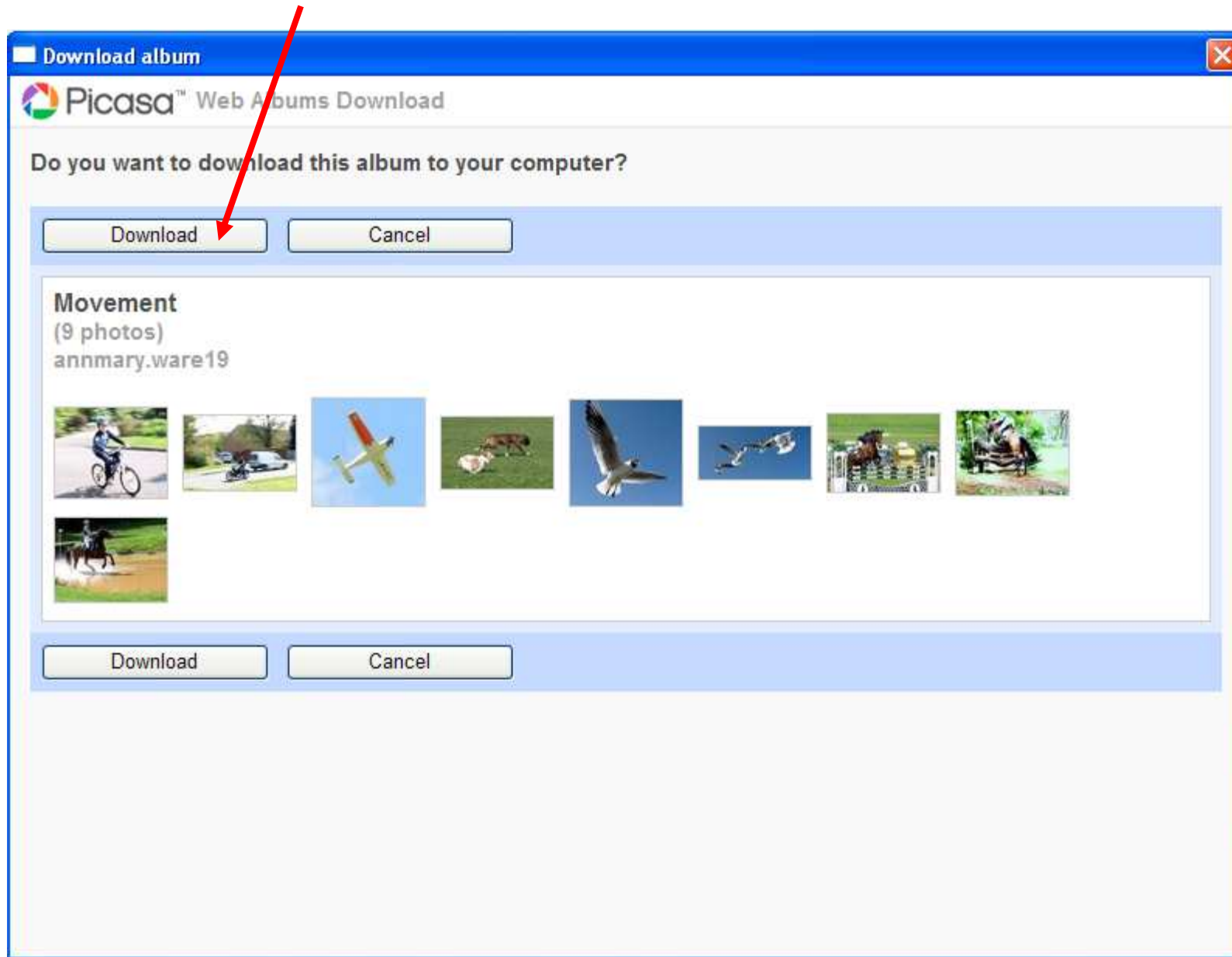

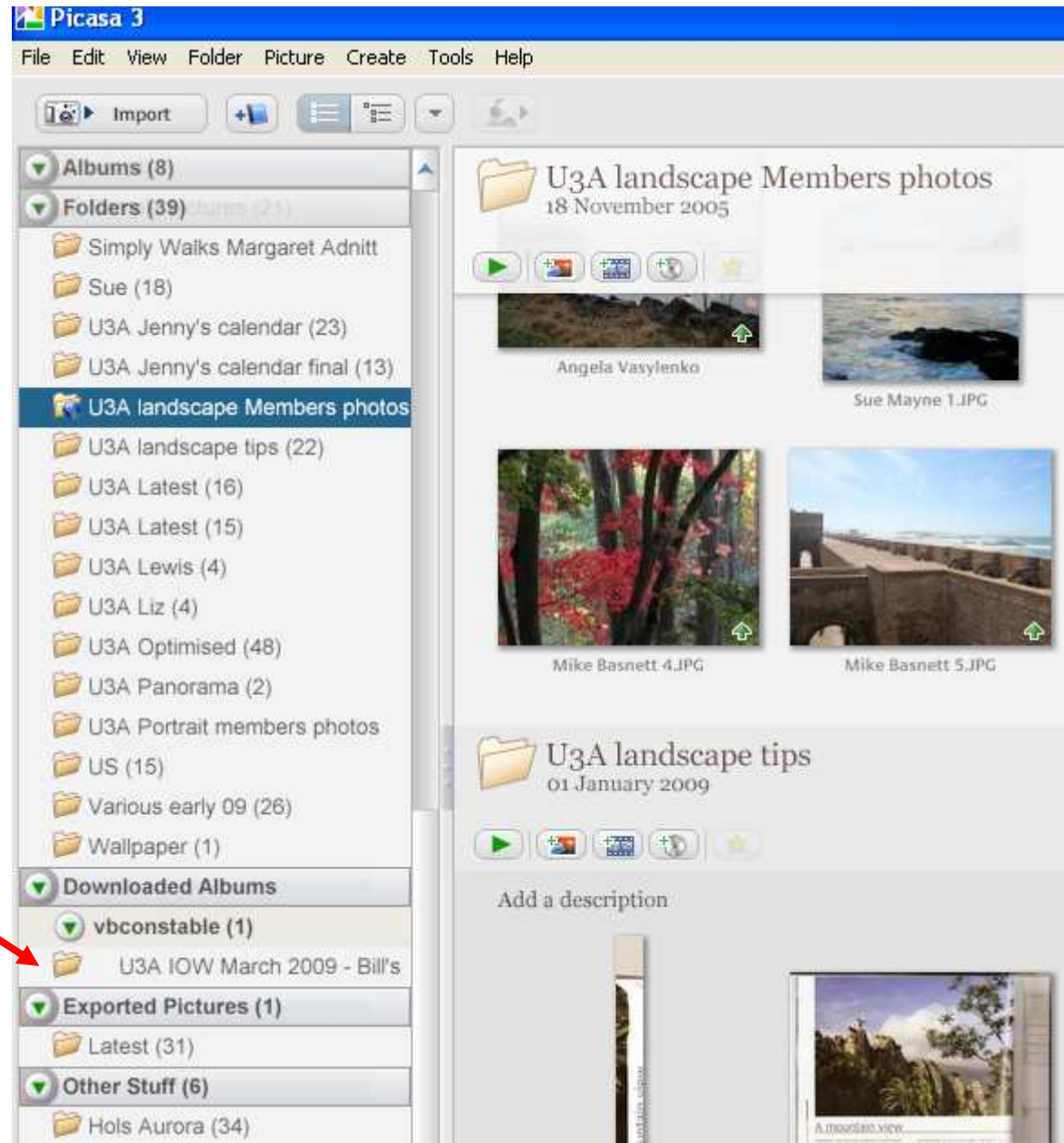

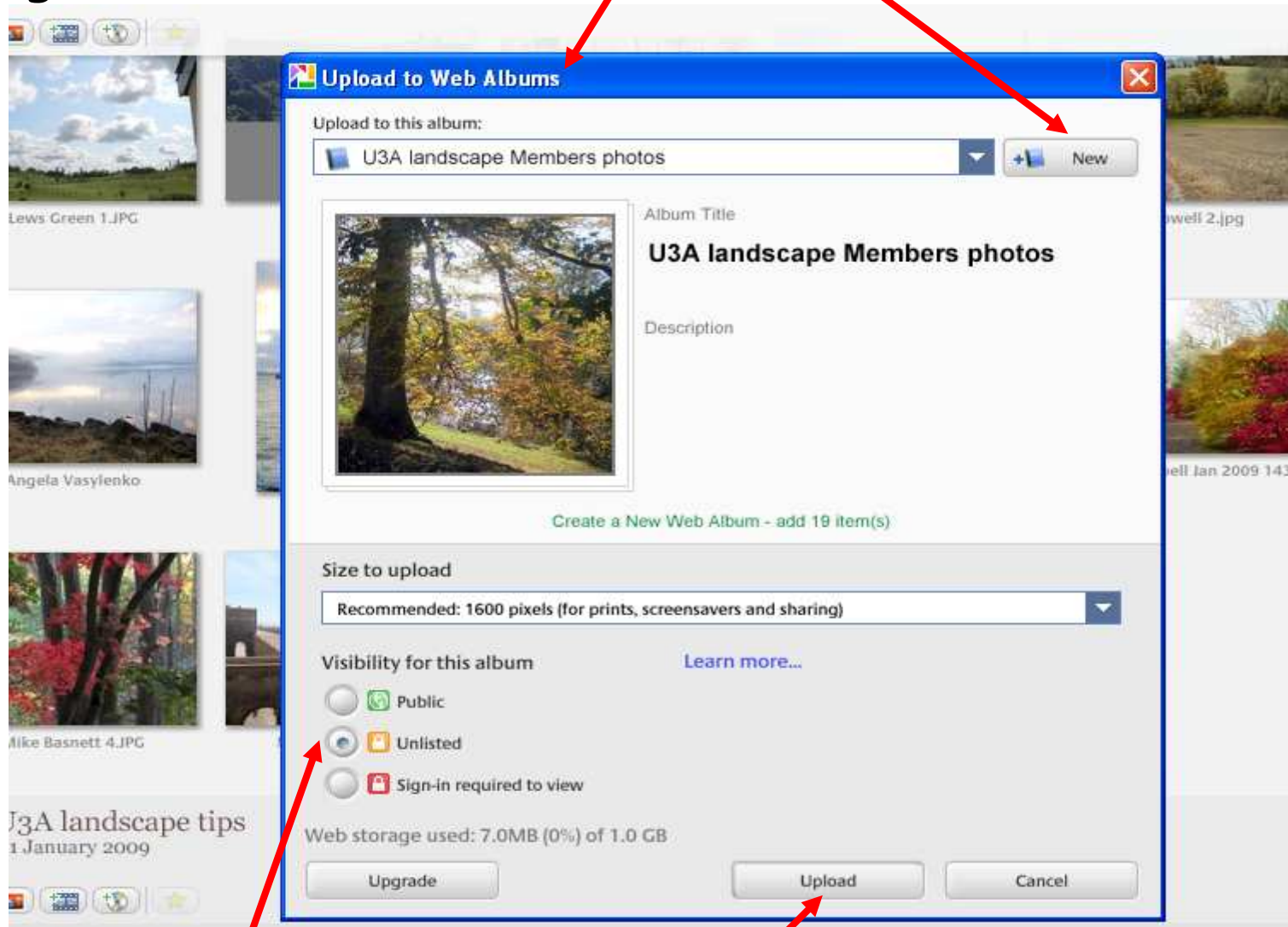
Downloaded album appears in your folder structure

- Click on upload button

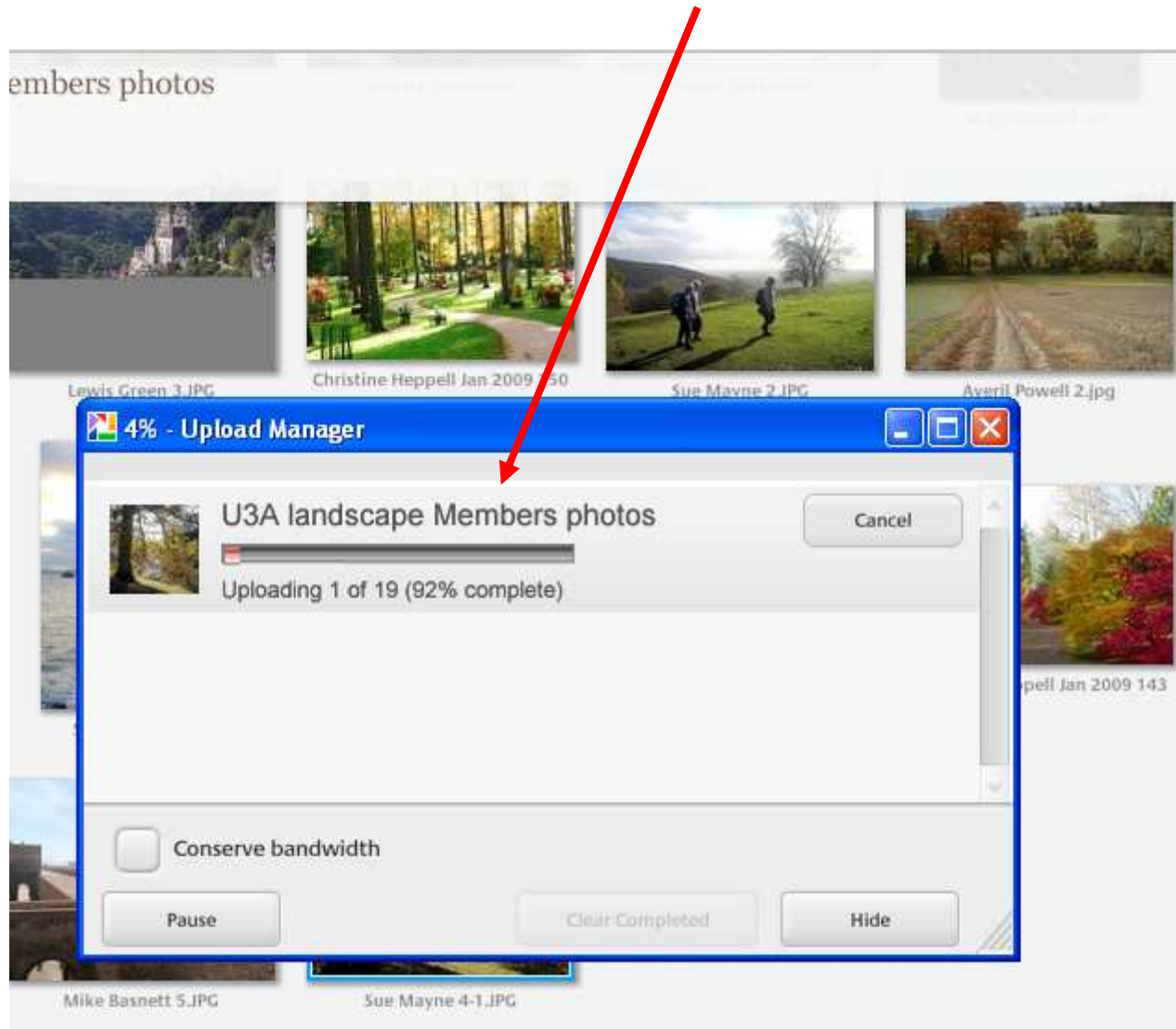
Decide whether album folder title is OK or a new one needs creating

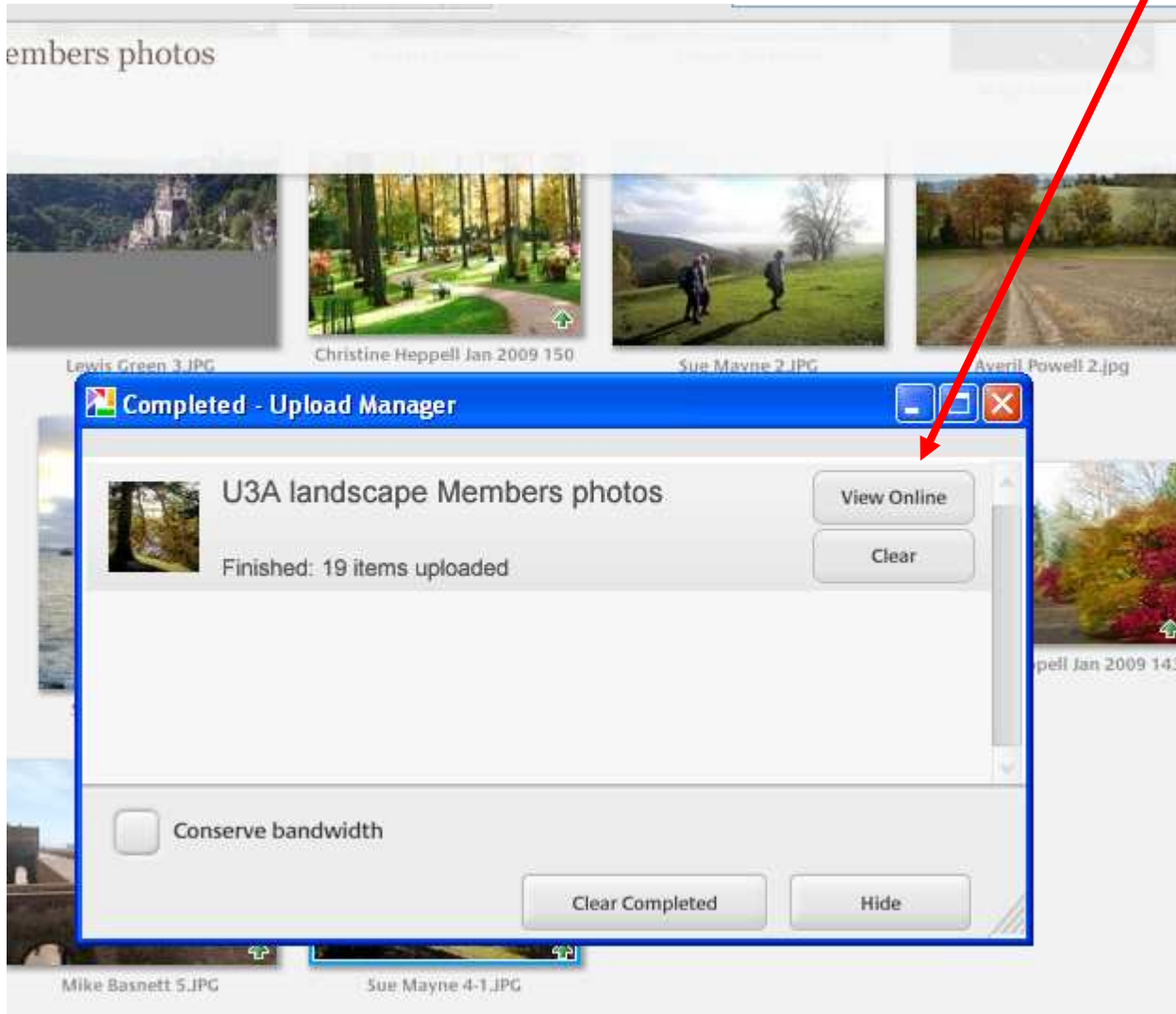
